
EXISTING I-395 HOV LANES

MINIMIZING IMPACTS TO THE COMMUNITY

VDOT and its private partners are committed to minimizing impacts during construction.

- Third lane will be constructed within existing footprint of 395 HOV lanes
- Won't take any homes or businesses
- New sound walls could require some easements but would be minimized as much as possible
- No major interchange construction will be required except for improvements to Eads Street interchange
- No lane closures during rush hour travel periods

Dedicated to robust public outreach.

- Meetings with local homeowner associations and community groups
- Ongoing updates and opportunities to engage with project officials using a multi-channel approach

CONSTRUCTION WILL BEGIN IN SUMMER 2017 WITH PROJECT SCHEDULED TO OPEN IN FALL 2019

KEY PROJECT BENEFITS

ADD CAPACITY ON I-395

The project will add a third reversible lane on I-395, reducing congestion and improving mobility for users.

SUPPORT JOBS

Construction of the project will generate approximately 600 jobs and more than half a billion dollars of economic activity.

PROVIDE NEW TRAVEL CHOICES

The project will extend the benefits and travel options of the 95 Express Lanes farther north to the DC line, allowing drivers a new option to pay a toll during rush hour for a faster, more predictable trip.

GENERATE TRANSIT FUNDING

The project will be designed to utilize a portion of toll revenues for annual funding for transit, like improved bus service.

ENHANCE PENTAGON ACCESS

Improvements at the project's northern section, including the Eads Street interchange and Pentagon South Parking lot, will make it easier for travelers to access the Pentagon and Crystal City.

IMPROVING TRAVEL IN THE REGULAR LANES

The 395 Express Lanes will provide improvements and time savings to the regular lanes as well.

DELIVER ADDITIONAL CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS

Enhancements to the regular lanes and Pentagon parking area will further improve travel times and transit access and circulation.




\$15M ANNUAL TRANSIT PAYMENT FUNDED BY TOLL REVENUES
